
Letter From The Principal


Letter From The Principal

It looks like its been a busy winter for the lads!




Events


Leaving Cert Breakfast






The TY Mini Company Market was the first of its kind, and was a huge success. Students were given the chance to see the array of goods available from this year's Ty Mini Companies.





